Report of School Directors

The School Directors met at Clarendon Flats June 28 and organized with Frank Teer as chairman and clerk. Each director was appointed truant officer. Voted to have only 34 weeks of school. At the time of organizing we decided to commence our schools the last Monday in August and have a longer vacation between the winter and spring terms, so as to avoid the cold weather, deep snows and poor traveling, to see if by so doing we could get better attendance than we have got so far.

The school board wishes to thank the selectmen for giving us the extra \$1,000 to run our schools with, over the 80 cents voted.

There has been a new wire fence built around the school grounds at North Clarendon and the Springs, and also the Springs school house has been shingled. New seats have been put in the East Clarendon school room.

Your chairman wishes to state that nearly all the repairs to be made the coming year will be through the Parent-Teachers Association, and the state aid which we can get for this work. Should this state aid be discontinued after July 1, the Parent-Teachers Association and Mothers' Clubs will have to help us out.

We are paying high school tuition for 25 pupils and all but 3 are in the first and second years' work. This will use a large amount of our school money, as we have to pay \$60 per pupil for a year.

I also suggest that you keep your grand list a little under \$7,000 so we can get one-third more rebate on our high school pupils.

Health Officer's Report

During 1922 the following communicable diseases have been reported from Clarendon: influenza 1, mumps 1, diphtheria 1.

During 1922 118 pupils have been examined, 76 found defective. The children having defective teeth were 74, throat 2, vision 7, spinal curvature due to defective posture 5, heart disease 1.

A contest has been started between the schools to see which one will have the greatest percentage of children without defects. The time for the closing of the contest is during the spring term, which will give all a chance to consult their dentist or physician. Medical inspection is not of much benefit to towns unless the people get the defects found in their children corrected. It is hoped that the contest between the schools will interest pupils and parents to get this done.
