## MINUTES OF TOWN MEETING MARCH 4, 1958

The annual meeting of the legal voters of the Town of Clarendon, held at 10 A. M. Standard Time in the Clarendon Town Hall was called to order by the Moderator, Amherst Weeks.

The Warning was read and business transacted as follows:

Article 1. Amherst Weeks was elected Moderator.

Article 2. After some discussion a motion was made and seconded that the Town Report be accepted.

Article 3. Motion made and carried that one Road Commissioner be elected by ballot.

Article 4. Officers—

Town Clerk—Mary H. Pratt by acclamation.

Town Treasurer—Mary H. Pratt by acclamation.

SELECTMAN for 3 years—

Nominated Chester Carrara, Leland Congdon, Harold E. Johnson.

1st ballot—Harold Johnson 34, Leland Congdon 26, Chester Carrara 18. Necessary for choice 40. No decision made.

2nd ballot—Harold Johnson 59, Leland Congdon 1, Chester Carrara 21. Necessary for choice 41. Harold Johnson elected.

ROAD COMMISSIONER—Motion made, seconded and carried that the Clerk cast one ballot for Carl Lanfear. It was so done. Carl Lanfear elected Road Commissioner.

#### OVERSEER OF THE POOR—

Nominations—George U. Holden and the Selectmen. By ballot George Holden 43, Selectmen 16. Necessary for choice, 30. George Holden elected Overseer.

#### LISTERS-

Before nominations were made H. Burdette Pratt gave a short talk on the seriousness of Listing and suggested that Listers be chosen as follows:—1 good real estate man, 1 good business man, and 1 good farmer. Joseph Raiche was elected

Lister for 3 years by a ballot of 59 votes.

The Moderator read the resignation of George Eldred and called for the election of a Lister to fill out his 2 remaining years.

Nominations—George Ridlon

By ballot—George Ridlon 43, Clayton Grover 1, John Pratt 1. Necessary for choice 23. George Ridlon elected Lister for 2 years.

The Moderator announced that a Lister for 1 year must be elected to fill out the unexpired term of Harold Johnson who resigned when elected Selectman.

Nominations: Robert J. Pratt.

By ballot—Robert J. Pratt 50, Milton Squier 2, Willard Squier 2. Necessary for choice 28. Robert J. Pratt elected Lister for 1 year.

H. Burdette Pratt spoke of a school for Listers held at the University of Vermont in October, lasting 3 days, sponsored by the State.

Motion made that it be compulsory for all Listers to attend this school, the Town paying their expenses.

By ballot—40 yes, 48 no.

Motion lost.

#### AUDITOR-

Nominations—Willard Dexter, Willard Squier. By ballot Willard Dexter 44, Willard Squier 43. Necessary

for choice 44. Willard Dexter elected Auditor.

Constable—George U. Holden elected Constable by acclamation Second Constable—None elected.

Town Grand Juror—Aldace Newton elected by acclamation.

Town Agent—Aldace Newton elected by acclamation.

School Director—Nominations—Leland Congdon, George Squier, Winslow Trask, John B. Congdon.

1st ballot—Leland Congdon 11, George 20, Winslow Trask 20, John Pratt 1, George Ridlon 3, J. B. Congdon 47.

Necessary or choice 52. No choice made.

2nd ballot—John B. Congdon 56, Winslow Trask 20, George Squier 21, Leland Congdon 8, John Pratt 1.

Necessary for choice 54. John B. Congdon elected School Director for 3 years.

Article 5. Town Highways.

25 cents on the dollar of the Grand List voted.

Article 6. RESURFACING. \$300.00 voted for resurfacing.

Article 7. New Black Top. \$2,000.00 voted for New Black Top.

Article 8. Retreatment. \$2,500.00 voted for Retreatment.

Article. 9. Wallingford Town Dump.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Town of Clarendon shall not use the Wallingford Town Dump.

H. Burdette Pratt spoke about the dump suggesting that it be closed by the Town Officers.

Motion made that the Selectmen tell the Town of Wallingford that the dump is a nuisance and must be moved. No second. No action taken.

Edward Briggs spoke of the need of the people on the west side of Town for a dump.

Motion made that the Selectmen ask the Green Mt. Marble Co. if the people on the west side of Town may use one of their old quarries for a dump. No second. No action taken.

Further discussion of the Wallingford Dump. Mr. Pratt states it is a public nuisance and should be closed. Mr. Chapman states it is a menace, may be the cause of accidents. Mr. Newton says responsibility for the dump is up to Clarendon. Mr. Rich says according to the State Board of Health, the responsibility for any damage arising from the dump lies with the Clarendon Board of Health consisting of the Clarendon Health Officer and the Town Selectmen.

Motion was made and seconded that the Town Selectmen take out an injunction against Wallingford prohibiting further dumping until provisions of the law have been complied with.

Vote No by acclamation.

A motion was made and seconded that the Selectmen be authorized to provide a dump for the people of Clarendon.

Motion carried by acclamation.

Article 10. Tuition.

Motion made and seconded that the Town pay the minimum or \$325.00 for High School Tuition.

Undecided by acclamation. By ballot Yes 81, No 30.

Motion carried.

Article 11. Motion carried by acclamation that taxes be paid to the Town Treasurer.

Article 12. Malt and vinous beverages—License to Sell.

By ballot-Yes 58, No 18.

Article 13. Spirituous Liquors—License to Sell.

By ballot-Yes 50, No 25.

Article 14. Motion made, seconded and carried that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow money for the use of the Town.

Article 15. Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Selectmen of the Town be authorized to acquire by gift, not purchase, land for a municipal forest.

Article 16. Motion made and seconded that the Quadrennial Appraisal be abolished.

Undecided by acclamation.

By ballot—Yes 45, No 43. Motion carried.

Article 17. Mr. Chapman suggested that since we have no Grand List on which to figure our tax the Tax Rate should be left to the Town Officers.

TOWN GENERAL TAX-

Motion made and seconded for a Town General Tax of \$2.75 to include 25c Road Tax already voted.

No decision by acclamation.

By ballot-Yes 50, No 51.

Motion Lost.

Motion made for a tax of \$2.50 to include 25c road tax already voted. Motion carried by acclamation.

Article 18. SCHOOL TAX.

Motion made, seconded and carried for a tax of \$4.75 for Schools.

Article 19. STATE AUDITORS.

Motion made, seconded and carried that we do not employ State Auditors.

Article 20. OTHER BUSINESS.

Motion was made seconded and carried that the minutes of this meeting be incorporated in the next Town Report.

Zeola Raiche reported that it may be possible and advisable to close two of the schools in Town. She asked how the people would feel about doing this.

A vote of confidence was given the Board of School Directors about closing any of the schools.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

On March 5, 1958 the Board of Selectmen for the Town of Clarendon held its first meeting. Charles Ruane was chosen to act as Chairman of the Board for the year.

The following officers:

Fence Viewers—Richard Pratt, Robert J. Pratt and Henry Potter.

Pound Keepers—Isadore LaVictoire and Hiram Spafford.

Inspector of Lumber—Howard Pierce.

Weigher of Coal—John Pratt.

Tree Warden—Hugh Leahey.

Arrangements were made for the purchase of officers' bonds from Ralph Stafford of Wallingford.

The Selectmen decided to meet once a month and more if necessary. The day was later changed to the first Saturday in the month.

It was agreed not to enter into any agreement about use of a dump with either the Town of Wallingford or the Sanitary Disposal people.

Mr. Abatiell was dismissed as Town Lawyer and it was voted not to retain any one Town Lawyer for the present.

Robert J. Pratt resigned as Lister for the Town and Milton Squier was appointed to take his place.

On the recommendation of the Town Auditors the Selectmen added 40c to the current tax of \$7.25 voted in the March Town Meeting.

John B. Congdon resigned as Civil Defence Director. No one has been appointed to take his place as yet.

John B. Congdon resigned as School Director and Mrs. Irene Hill was appointed to take his place.

In May the Selectmen and Town Road Commissioner met with the District Road Commissioner in Rutland to plan summer work on Clarendon Roads. Again the Selectmen requested further Black Top on the Creek Road. This time the request was granted.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Directors and Citizens of Clarendon, Vermont:

I submit my sixth annual report as your Superintendent of School.

The Clarendon Schools opened on Wednesday, September 3, 1958, with a total enrollment of 156 pupils.

New teachers were Miss Janice Lanzillo of Rutland in the North Primary School, Mrs. Mary Pratt of Clarendon in the grammar room of the Flats School, and Mrs. Alta Johnston of Ira in the Chippenhook School.

The Hill School was not opened this year. The Chippenhook School housed grades 5-8 and the Springs School, grades 1-4. Transportation was provided for the pupils to attend these two schools.

The East, Flats, Chippenhook, and the Springs Schools now have running water, flush toilets, and drinking fountains. The two North Clarendon Schools do not have these facilities. A public meeting was held last summer to see what could be done to improve the situation here but no solution resulted. The children of North Clarendon deserve better schools than they now have.

During the last school year, your School Department paid high-school tuition on eighty pupils who attended the following schools:

Tuition on these pupils cost \$22,348.04 which is 36% of the School Budget. Tuition costs will continue to increase.

Your School Directors and Superintendent recommend a school tax of \$4.75 be voted for the school year beginning on July 1, 1959. This is the same tax as this year. We feel that this will be sufficient for the operation of your schools.

# VERMONT STATE DEPRATMENT OF HEALTH ANNUAL TOWN REPORT, 1958

Through the following programs the State Department of Health works with the Health Officer and other officials, doctors and local citizens on community health. This report summarizes many of the services rendered to Clarendon last year and indicates other services available.

CANCER AND CHRONIC DISEASE: 1 person received services which included diagnosis and treatment at tumor clinics or financial aid toward hospitalization costs.

CHILD HEALTH SERVICES: 39 children attended 5 well-child and schhool conferences organized by the public health nurse. 5 children with orthopedic, cardiac, plastic or neurological conditions received services or appliances through clinics for handicapped children and 1 was given financial aid toward the cost of hospitalization.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE: 5 persons received chest x-rays; 11 children received immunizing series, including booster injections, against diphtheria, whooping cough, and or tetanus. The immunizing series against poliomyelitis were given to 71 children and adults.

Environmental Sanitation: A sanitarian or sanitary engineer made 52 inspections-consultations at the town's food and lodging places and 19 concerning water supply, sewage disposal, public buildings and other problems to protect health through improved town sanitation.

LABORATORY SERVICES: As aids in the control of communicable disease, tests were performed on 13 water samples, 32 blood specimens and 3 other specimens. Vaccines, antitoxins and biologicals were distributed for protection against communicable diseases.

Mental Health: 2 persons and groups were served at the guidance clinic or through educational meetings or consultations. Services to individuals included 10-interviews with the psychiatrist, psychologist or psychiatric social worker. Financial and other assistance to develop local projects for prevention, treatment or education in the field of mental health were available.

Public Health Nursing: The public health nurse's headquarters is in Rutland. Assisted by local people, she served well-child and school conferences, x-ray and immunization clinics. She visited homes, doctors and agencies, making 99 visits on behalf of 30 persons and community health activities. Her service is an essential element in the department's programs for health promotion, disease prevention, diagnosis, treatment and education.

# VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE Montpelier, Vermont

This is the twenty-third annual report which I have made to the citizens of Clarendon regarding State payments in your municipality of various types of assistance and welfare during 1958. The support and cooperation of town officers and people generally over this long period is gratefully acknowledged.

This year marks the greatest improvement in the assistance programs since they were inaugurated many years ago. Due to an increase in Federal funds available to the State and a fortunate combination of circumstances it has been possible to lift the ceiling in the three adult programs from \$63.00 to \$75.00 a month and in the Aid to Dependent Children program to \$45.00 for the eligible mother or relative, \$45.00 for the first child and \$25.00 for each additional child. Our food budget allowances have also been increased. This not only furnishes more financial security to the individuals themselves but should also relieve the towns and cities of much of the expense of supplementation. Although the bill has not passed the legislature at this writing, a program for nursing home care and limited hospitalization for eligible receipients of Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Blind and Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled has the endorsement of the town and city managers. This will relieve the towns and cities of 65 percent of the cost for which they are currently obligated. No additional state appropriation is proposed or required. Actually, the current total requests of the Department of Social Welfare for 1960-1961 are less than was appropriated for 1958-1959.
