INTRODUCTION

For a mid-sized city in the middle of the midwestern industrial belt, Fort Wayne, Indiana enjoys an unusually rich tapestry of historical tradition and study. From ethnic church histories to military records and a host of genealogical sources, the number of books and articles about the city's past exceeds those of every other community in the state, including Indianapolis. Two reasons for the abundance of historical writing may stem from Fort Wayne's age and its location as a crossroads. Developing as it did at the confluence of three rivers, the region has seen a progression of explorers, adventurers, soldiers, missionaries, canal builders, and entrepreneurs since the late seventeenth century, each of whom has added some facet or thread to the tapestry. Many of those threads have led to the writing of books or pamphlets. The diversity that resulted from its location as a transportation hub has given Fort Wayne a big city atmosphere and a rich cultural melting pot. The resulting society created by the mixture of Indian, French, English, Yankee, German, and African-American influences has helped to foster a climate - and for some, perhaps a passion - for tracing and preserving those traditions.

Age and ethnicity represent only part of the equation, however. Histories have sprung from a variety of other sources. Mercantile interests and a spirit of boosterism in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries spurred the writing of company histories and pictorial works that advertised Fort Wayne as an ideal place for settlement and investment. Strong cultural institutions such as the Allen County Public Library, the Allen County-Fort Wayne

Historical Society, the Allen County Genealogical Society of Indiana, Inc., and a host of schools, churches, clubs, and civic groups have encouraged additional writing. Through its aggressive policies of collection development and preservation photocopying, the Library's Historical Genealogy Department has proved itself a catalyst for gathering and retaining both primary source records and a variety of ephemera documenting aspects of the city's history. ARCH, Incorporated and the city's Historic Preservation Office have heightened public awareness of the richness of Fort Wayne's architectural past. WFWA and WBNI, the city's Public Broadcasting affiliates, have built on that historical appreciation through programming choices such as "Fort Wayne Time Capsule."

Underlying all of these efforts is an almost unquenchable grassroots interest in local history. Since the Civil War, Fort Wayne's public has supported the publication of a succession of local histories and pictorial works, finding in their pages a source of both nostalgia family memorial. Although local histories are not unique to Fort Wayne, the sheer number of works on so many diverse topics suggests a strong affinity for the process of preservation, writing, and remembering, that emanates from a cross-section of the city. It embodies both a cultural pride and a curiosity that resonate deep within the community, an interest not limited by class, ethnic or religious boundaries.

The research and writing of Fort Wayne's history, or tracing the genealogy of one of its families, can be a rewarding and satisfying journey. I use the word "journey" to convey the process of research - that it is never accomplished in haste and nearly always involves an accumulation of knowledge gleaned from a variety of sources. The breadth of these sources presents the researcher with both rewards and challenges. The reward comes in finding an indexed or abstracted work, a bibliography, or an original document within easy access, that will illuminate or provide the foundation for a new historical inquiry. The challenge is met in

attempting to locate *every* source that can shed light on that inquiry.

This guide to the Fort Wayne holdings of the Allen County Public Library is offered as a road map for anyone wanting to begin the journey. I have designed it as a kind of compass for navigating the often bewildering array of historical sources available in several of the Library's departments, with particular emphasis on the holdings of the Genealogy Department. Although it is not comprehensive and does not include other towns in Allen County, it may help illuminate various research paths in the city that may not be obvious to the researcher working solely with the online catalog. It should be used in conjunction with the catalog, for a keyword search may bring up resources not envisioned by this work, or new materials acquired since its writing.

The user of this guide will find the Library's sources arranged in a standard bibliographical format, grouped under categories alphabetically by subject. Some sources appear more than once if they overlap several categories. Many of the citations have been given brief annotations to alert the user to their advantages and possible pitfalls. Others have been left without comment in the belief that the title offers a sufficient summary of the contents. Moreover, each chapter or category also contains a brief introduction, in part to suggest uses for the material and in part to offer suggestions for other avenues of research.

No guidebook, including this one, tells *everything* a researcher needs to know to begin historical study - for Fort Wayne or anywhere else. Some tasks will always require hard-nosed investigations: discovering ways of ferreting out new sources of information and learning through trial and error the best research techniques and the most productive sources. The progression of time will also render this guide out-of-date as more historiography of the city appears in print and more primary sources are microfilmed. It is, at best, a "snapshot" of historical sources at the Allen County Public Library at the close of the twentieth century.

If it can help a researcher begin a plan of historical inquiry, or suggest some additional avenues of investigation, it will have fulfilled its mission.

ADOPTION RECORDS

Adoption records remain sealed in Allen County. The researcher seeking the names of birth parents is not likely to find the answer at the Library. That said, some tools are available for research that may provide help in the search, especially if the researcher already has some information. The two sources listed below provide rare first-hand adoption information. Other sources worth searching include the city directories, the extensive collection of school yearbooks, and the newspapers. Birth parents seeking children given up for adoption may find Hugh Fowler's *Birthdates Extracted from Northeast Indiana Marriage Licenses* (listed under Vital Records) to be helpful, though it remains a difficult source to use. Locally, Catholic Charities and Lutheran Social Services retain adoption records for those agencies. Catholic Charities also houses the records of several local orphanages, which may provide the genealogist with clues to historical adoptions.

AFRICAN-AMERICANS

In recent years, local historians have begun to conduct original research on Fort Wayne's African-American community, with more work, especially on the underground railroad, sure to follow. The studies listed here include several types. Several could be classed as historical studies of the community, while others are of a more sociological nature and offer "snapshots" of the community at a particular date. Both are useful research tools for the local historian. In addition to these, George Mather's book, *Frontier Faith*, offers an excellent chapter on the origin of African-American churches, and his bibliography deserves close study.

Genealogists researching African-Americans should make liberal use of the federal censuses and contemporary newspapers for information about specific citizens. Sadly, African-Americans were left out of most of the local histories of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Obituaries, when found, can offer useful substitutes.

One of the principal African-American genealogical sources, if found, would be the *Negro Register*, a volume kept by the court clerk listing all African-American residents in the 1850s. The book is listed on a 1941 inventory of courthouse record books, but has since disappeared.

ARCHITECTURE, TOURS, AND ARCHITECTS

Fort Wayne's rich architectural heritage has formed the basis for the publication of a number of books. Some discuss architectural styles by using specific examples of buildings in the city. Others offer tours that allow one to see these examples first-hand. Still others represent advertising catalogs written by architects to promote their skills to interested buyers. Together, they comprise different facets of Fort Wayne's written architectural story.

Researchers with an interest in a particular architect should also look for references in the list of books under the "Histories (General and Biographical Works)" section. Works such as Bert Griswold's *Builders of Greater Fort Wayne* sometimes feature biographies of prominent architects. The collections of ARCH, the City Historic Preservation Office, and the Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society also remain essential for any inquiry into this field. The city's Historic Preservation Office has compiled several useful walking tour maps for the West Central, Williams-Woodland, and South Wayne neighborhoods.

Some researchers of historic houses should search for copies of architectural plans, abstracts, and old photographs. The ARCH office has copies of some plans and a few abstracts, but most often such items are found in the home itself if they survive at all. Lost abstracts can sometimes be reconstructed through careful research in the Recorder's Office. Photographic evidence of lost architectural features is often somewhat more abundant. The Library's digital collection, available online, contains numerous house photographs. All of the above-named city offices also have excellent collections. The researcher should note, as well, the list of sources in the Pictorial Works section, many of which contain photographs of houses.

ARTS

The “arts” category includes material on such subjects as painters, musicians, sculptors, and theater in Fort Wayne. A growing interest in the history of the local art scene has led to several recent studies. The books and articles in this category include pictorial works, art and musical histories, yearbooks of the Art School, manuscripts such as the theater scrapbooks, theater histories, and some festival and dedicational programs. In addition, the Art, Music, and Audio-Visual Department maintains a biographical file on late twentieth century local artists.

Beyond the Library, local agencies such as Artlink and the Fort Wayne Museum of Art offer useful resources of information on local artists. The Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society houses the largest collection of works by local painters.

BIOGRAPHIES

This section departs from the arrangement of the others in that it follows a subject rather than an author listing. The subject of the book or article appears first in brackets as a means of helping the user identify material of interest. Under this category are *specific* biographies, genealogies, published family Bibles, and manuscript collections with Fort Wayne connections, although the list is by no means complete. Also included are books about houses belonging to or associated with specific people or families.

Beyond this guide, the online catalog should be the starting point for researching the biography of a local person or family. Also one should examine the *Index of Persons and Firms* for references in the county histories. Biographical works that cover more than one person or family can be found under "Histories (General and Biographical Works)." Newspaper obituaries can also be a rich source of biographical information. The collection of the Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society may also prove helpful for manuscripts and biographical works on specific persons; private corporate archives belonging to the companies of prominent business leaders offer another avenue of research.

CEMETERIES, BURIAL RECORDS AND CEMETERY HISTORIES

Cemetery records offer both the genealogist and local historian an important source of vital record information. In addition, the iconography of headstones has pertinence to the development of Fort Wayne art, though it has been little-studied. Listed here are transcriptions of headstone inscriptions, burial records maintained by sextons in cemetery offices, and burial permits, all of genealogical value. As headstones disappear in increasing numbers due to vandalism and weather, the value of some transcriptions will only rise in importance.

One will also find in this category histories and promotional works for the city's principal cemetery, Lindenwood, which may be of interest to the local historian. Some records of large cemeteries, including Greenlawn, are not available at the Library. The Lindenwood researcher should also know that its office also houses plat books and a nineteenth century daily burial register not available at the Library.

CENSUS SCHEDULES

A fundamental source for the genealogist, census records are sometimes overlooked by local historians researching houses, businesses, churches, or families in non-genealogical contexts. Beginning in 1850, the census recorded the age, state or country of birth, property value, and a variety of other data of value to all local historical studies. They can help establish the identities of residents and the composition of streets and neighborhoods at a given moment. A complete transcript of the federal census of 1850 for Allen County exists in book form with an everyname index and is listed below.

In addition to the sources listed in this guide, the Library houses indexes to heads of household from federal census schedules of Indiana censuses from 1820 to 1870. The original census population, agricultural, and manufacturing schedules for Allen County are also available on microfilm in the Genealogy Department and provide a wealth of statistical data. Check the microtext catalog for the film roll numbers. Aggregate census statistics for the United States, including data on Fort Wayne and Allen County from 1830 to 1990, can be found in the Government Documents Collection /I7 through I13 and C3/ in the Business and Technology Department.

CHURCH HISTORIES AND RECORDS

Since Fort Wayne is nicknamed the “city of churches,” it seems appropriate that the largest component of this guide should be devoted to churches. This category includes not only copies of original church records, but also congregational directories, histories, and other ephemera. Arrangement is by denomination, opening with a general section on religion in Fort Wayne and ecumenical organizations. Within the denominational categories, the arrangement is alphabetical by author; hence, all sources for a particular congregation are not necessarily grouped together. An attempt has been made to identify churches and congregations that have changed their name or merged with others. Sometimes the Library’s holdings for a particular church appear in the online catalog under one name and not the other.

Church records have many uses. The directories help identify local persons with photographs - an important tool for mid- to late twentieth century research. Copies of original church records can help the genealogist identify family relationships, locate vital record information, and in some instances, provide the names of towns in Europe where immigrants originated. Church minute books can help historians write congregational histories and provide a context for the registers. Many of the church histories contain historic photographs of church buildings, clergy, and church members, which should not be overlooked.

CIVIC PLANS

On paper, dreamers have reinvented Fort Wayne in a number of different incarnations over a span of several decades. Some of the most elaborate visions occurred in the 1960s, a time of rampant social change when there was, for some, an optimism about what government could accomplish. This category includes a list of some of those plans and designs, although there are many more economic studies and reports in the collection of the Business and Technology Department that are not included here. Some transportation and airport plans appear in the "Transportation" section of this guide, while plans for specific neighborhoods can be located under the "Neighborhoods" section. As a whole, civic plans have value to the historian as a measure of how city leaders envisioned its future at different points in its history. Some of these visions were realized, some were not, but together, they reflect society's perception of its problems and the paths to their remedy.

CIVIL WAR

Local interest in the Civil War remains widespread among local historians, photograph collectors, and genealogists interested in finding evidence of an ancestor's military service. In this category one will find a number of tools that will aid in the search: rosters, manuscript transcriptions, burial records, and biographical sketches of Allen County men (and a few women) involved in the war. In addition to these sources, the researcher should also examine the "Indiana Service Record Index" and the "Index of Union Pensioners," available on microfilm through the publications of the National Archives. The eight-volume *Report of the Adjutant General of the State of Indiana, 1861-1865*, /973.74 In2ad/ contains a complete roster of Indiana troops listed by regiment and company. The Genealogy Department also houses an extensive collection of regimental histories for many Indiana regiments, both on microfilm and in book form.

CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

In the 20th century, Fort Wayne blossomed into a strong club town. Fraternal orders for men, which had existed since the mid-19th century, were joined by a plethora of social and professional clubs for men and women. With subjects ranging from business and literature to child-rearing and gardening, they became major social outlets in the early decades of the century, and a few continue to exist at this writing. This category includes a variety of records from many of those clubs, primarily club rosters, by-laws, and programs. One will also find several histories of fraternal orders and some fraternal records. Club records can help the genealogist document relatives and provide the local historian with clues about the breadth of twentieth century culture at its most grassroots level.

COURT RECORDS

Court records offer valuable primary source data on people, crime, divorce, and other issues of interest to the social historian, the local historian, and the genealogist. Many of the records here represent microfilmed versions of original volumes kept in the Allen County Courthouse. A number of references pertain to original court books discarded by the courthouse and now in the Genealogy Department's collection. Divorces are here, but wills and guardianship records (grouped together with other probate records), and naturalization records are excluded from this list and given separate subject headings.

Court records remain a challenge to use. Some courts in Allen County had exclusive jurisdiction in certain matters; others had concurrent jurisdiction, sharing responsibility with another court. Finding the right court for the right kind of case can be difficult. Civil records can be found in both the Circuit Court and Court of Common Pleas dockets. In the 19th century, criminal records are almost always in the Circuit Court.

Further complicating matters is the fact that indexing is often incomplete. The records of misdemeanor cases for much of Fort Wayne in the late nineteenth century are no longer extant. A few original court docket books are available in the collection of the Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society and are presently not indexed. Some records of the defunct City Courts, including a significant docket book from 1902 to 1910, remain under the jurisdiction of the City Clerk and are housed in the basement of the City-County Building.

CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT

The study of crime in Fort Wayne's past remains an intriguing and little-explored subject. Further study of court records, listed in the previous category, may yield new interpretations of the city's rich legal history. Most of the studies in this field constitute articles and short works on various aspects of city crime and law enforcement, from murder to gambling to bootlegging. Arrest statistics from 1895 to 1915 can be found under the Police Department report in the *Annual Message of the Mayor of Fort Wayne* (see the "Municipal Records" section), along with other Police references.

DIRECTORIES

Directories have documented the citizens and institutions of Fort Wayne since 1858, and the Library's collection of these volumes remains the city's largest. Directories offer a number of uses to the researcher. The genealogist will find them a helpful source for documenting the addresses and occupations of ancestors on a yearly basis, making them a valuable tool for finding individuals between the federal census enumerations. House and architectural historians find directories essential for documenting the owners of houses and buildings at a given time. Business historians and antique dealers find the listings of businesses and the abundant advertising to be useful in dating artifacts. Many directories contain extensive lists of institutions, churches, fraternal orders, municipal officials, and charitable institutions that help document the city's cultural history. Beyond the conventional city directories and telephone books are a number of more specialized directories that are seldom used but worth consulting in some research projects.

ETHNIC GROUP HISTORIES AND RECORDS

Immigrants have enriched the heritage of Fort Wayne almost from the time of the town's inception. A small number of studies have been compiled on the histories and records of various ethnic groups, and a list of the Library's holdings by group follows. (African-Americans and Native Americans have separate categories, in part because of the volume of material). For some groups, there are no individualized written histories, and indeed, much work remains to be done in studying ethnic groups, particularly in the 20th century. HISTORIES (GENERAL & BIOGRAPHICAL WORKS)

General histories offer a good, basic starting point for any historical inquiry into Fort Wayne's history. The books listed below have various strengths and weaknesses. Some are filled with local trivia and minutia that may yield a fact about a local person, business, or institution. Several works offer academic treatments that are rich in perspective with only moderate detail. A significant number are chiefly biographical works - highly complimentary to their subjects - containing only incidental local history but are nonetheless valuable local sources. Still others are mostly pictorial in nature. Use them all with care if launching a new historical project. Look at the documentation, if it exists, and evaluate the primary sources, when possible.

A useful and often-neglected source that serves roughly as a newspaper index, establishing dates of civic and cultural events and visits of celebrities to Fort Wayne.

HISTORIES (EARLY TO 1820, INCLUDING FORTS)

The large number of historical works on Fort Wayne has necessitated that they be divided by time period. In this section are works on the earliest era of Fort Wayne history, during which a succession of military forts built by the French, British, and Americans, were located on the site. Also included here are some personal accounts of the War of 1812 and the early national period, written by soldiers stationed at the fort.

The quality of the accounts in this category varies. Some of the best-written academic treatments are the works of Poinsette and Woehrmann. Beyond the sources on this list, the researcher should explore the manuscript sources of the Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society and the National Archives for information on the forts.

HISTORIES (ca. 1821-1900, & CANAL ERA)

The second phase in Fort Wayne's history covers the bulk of the nineteenth century, the period following the withdrawal of the military garrison, the building of the canal, the aftermath of the Civil War, the rapid industrial growth, and the so-called Gilded Age. A great variety of sources are found here, some of them contemporary reminiscences, and a number of them secondary works written more recently. The principal primary sources for this time period remain the newspaper holdings (see the Newspaper category), the county courthouse records, and the few collected family papers (see the Biography section). Some of the works below have useful bibliographies, especially the works of Poinsatte and Mather.

HISTORIES (20TH CENTURY)

The final section of Fort Wayne history comprises the varied body of historiography from the 20th century. Though not large in this general section, many more titles on specific 20th century subjects appear in other categories of this guide. Included here are works about the Progressive Era, the Great Depression, the post-war 1950s and the turbulent 1960s. There are some first-hand narratives and memoirs, but the majority represent some aspect of the century. Ankenbruck's book remains the best overall account.

INDEXES AND GUIDES

Guides to historical research in Fort Wayne are relatively few in number. Cramton's *Historic Houses*, listed, below retains its original relevance despite its date, but there are few other comprehensive guides. The belief of some library users that "everything is on the Internet" has not come to pass, at least at the time of the writing of this guide, though the promise of greater digitization of sources suggests easier future access to individual book and article indexes. The *Periodical Source Index (Parsi)*, produced by the Allen County Public Library Foundation and available online, offers extensive access to citations of articles written about Fort Wayne. It should be a major source for any city researcher, especially for new material published since the writing of this guide.

INSTITUTIONS AND HOSPITALS

Institutional records for Fort Wayne remain relatively scarce, at least in the Library's holdings. Some records may still exist within some institutions; others may be lost altogether. Where they do survive, they can yield a windfall of information about patients and inmates. The Asylum records (listed below) provide a valuable first-hand account of the poorest segment of Fort Wayne's society that was forced to live there. In addition to this primary source are a variety of secondary sources, including histories of various institutions and hospitals. Other medical references may be found in the "Medical History" category.

Orphanage records have value both to social historians, genealogists, and adoption researchers, though they can be difficult to find. The researcher should check with Catholic Charities for records of the Woodhaven or Crosshaven Children's Home, spanning from 1957 to 1978. The parish register from St. Vincent's Orphanage is available at the Library on microfilm, while some lists of child inmates, 1900s to 1960s, are available at Catholic Charities. The whereabouts of records of the Allen County Children's Home - the county's largest orphanage - is not known.

LAND RECORDS

Land records have a number of applications to genealogy and local history. To the genealogist, a deed or a land grant can help establish the precise location of ancestral land, allowing one to learn the names of other persons (possibly relatives) who had adjoining property holdings, though this was more true of rural Allen County than urban Fort Wayne. Often family relationships can be gleaned from deed records, including the names of spouses, and occasionally, children. The names of witnesses to deeds can provide additional clues. Local historians find deed records an essential tool for tracing the histories of houses and commercial buildings. The sources listed below include filmed copies of original deeds, land grant records from the Fort Wayne Land Office, and some secondary sources which either index or abstract land records. Copies of original deed books are located in the County Recorder's Office in the City-County Building.

LIBRARY

Perhaps it is not at all surprising that the Library should house an extensive collection of its own records that preserve information about its history, collection, and policies. Only a portion of those records are listed here. They include published histories, bibliographies, and reports. None have enduring genealogical value, but they do help document the growth of a local cultural institution in the 20th century.

MAPS

One of the most intriguing portions of the Library's local history collection is its large assortment of historic maps of Fort Wayne. Maps offer the researcher a variety of research avenues. On a basic level, they can help document ward boundaries and street name changes that can assist local historians, as well as genealogists using census records. Some of the more detailed maps, such as the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps, show the dimensions of lots and outlines of structures with address numbers - an essential tool for doing historical house and commercial building research. The bird's eye views provide panoramas of the city, showing streets and neighborhood structures for which there may be no known photographs. The Library's maps are not well-cataloged, and the user may find the following list to be the most complete one available.

MEDICAL HISTORY AND RECORDS

In addition to the hospital records that appear under "Institutions," the Library houses some works relating to medicine and medical practice in Fort Wayne. These include physician and dentist licenses, records of the Department of Public Health, and Geller's excellent public health history. Private patient records, except what might be found in the Asylum records, are not part of the Library's holdings. Local hospitals may keep some older records, but no inventory of these is available at the Library.

MILITARY RECORDS (LATE 19th & 20TH CENTURIES)

This category is comprised of books and articles devoted to the military history of Fort Wayne's residents from the Spanish-American War to the Persian Gulf War (the records of the Civil War are categorized separately in this guide). Included here are a few primary source burial registers, some newspaper extracts, and a few secondary lists of soldiers taken from various sources, most of them from the 20th century. Researchers should also check the service record index of Spanish-American War veterans available on microfilm. Original military service records from the First and Second World War may be housed in the National Personnel Record Center in St. Louis, Missouri, though significant portions of government records have been destroyed. The Indiana State Archives in Indianapolis is also an excellent source for military records from the state.

MORTUARIES

Funeral home records provide an excellent source of both primary and secondary source data on city residents. Fort Wayne remains fortunate that so many mortuaries have extensive business histories extending to the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Some of the records listed here are among the oldest extant in Indiana. Researchers will note that several funeral homes, including D. O. McComb, are not included here, because they have not allowed their records to be copied by the Library or the Allen County Genealogical Society. One will need to contact those mortuaries directly for records.

The history of city government and its various agencies remains, in many ways, a wide-open field deserving of further study. Although a few secondary works have appeared as books and articles, many other aspects of the city's administrative bureaucracy have yet to be researched.

Under this "municipal" category are records pertaining to the mayor, common council, local utilities, and such agencies as the police and fire departments. The following list includes a variety of sources, some secondary, some primary, including municipal reports, histories, programs and brochures, ordinance records, lists of officials, and a few original minute books. NATIVE AMERICANS (HISTORY AND RECORDS)

Tracing the genealogy of 18th and 19th century members of the local Miami tribe remains a nearly-impossible undertaking, due in great degree to the scarcity of records. The Library houses a few tribal enrollments on microfilm. In addition to these records, the researcher may find some of the published Indian Agency letterbooks of value. Some are listed here; others are included in the section on early Fort Wayne history.

Secondary works on the Miami are somewhat more plentiful. Rafert's book listed below remains one of the best studies and includes an excellent bibliography for further research. The user should also see the specific biographies of Chief Richardville and Little Turtle in the "Biographies" category.

NATURALIZATION RECORDS

Naturalization or citizenship records represent useful tools for tracing and documenting immigrants to the Fort Wayne area. The city is fortunate to have a large portion of its records both intact and extracted in a readily-accessible format. These, together with the microfilms of some original records, make it relatively easy for researchers to find references to an ancestor.

The researcher should be aware of several facts about naturalization records in Indiana in order to make the most effective use of these documents. Naturalization proceedings could occur in all levels of courts, both at the federal, state, and local levels, although the latter remained the most popular venue during most of the 19th century. Beginning in 1906, an increasing number of naturalizations took place in federal courts, and after 1929, all of them occurred there. One will note on the list that follows that these federal records are not among those that have been microfilmed or abstracted. They are available at two locations: in the records of the National Archives-Great Lakes Branch in Chicago, and in the Federal Courthouse on Harrison Street in Fort Wayne.

Several types of documents were typically filed during the naturalization process, and the researcher should know what type of record he or she is examining. "First papers" or "declarations of intention" were filed at the time the alien made his initial request to become a citizen, and these records usually offer the most information. Often the applicant would list the port and date of arrival and the country of origin (though not the specific town until the 20th century). First papers can help in locating passenger lists, but the 19th century records have only limited value for pinpointing European places of origin.

"Second papers" and naturalization certificates, filed later in the recording process, were not as informative and sometimes only listed the country of origin from which the alien was renouncing

allegiance. Because it was not necessary for first or second papers to be filed in the same court, researchers may find that their ancestors moved, with second papers in Allen County but first papers filed elsewhere. One should also know that before women had the vote, only men were naturalized. Women and minor children were typically assumed to be naturalized at the time of their husband or father, though some immigrant boys later sought re-naturalization as adults.

Beyond their genealogical value, naturalization records can help the local historian document when local individuals arrived in Fort Wayne, perhaps in a secondary way assisting with the dating of a house or business. Social historians may find naturalization data useful for determining patterns of immigration by date, though all of the abstracts follow alphabetical arrangements.

NEIGHBORHOOD, STREET, AND SPECIFIC HOUSE HISTORIES

The histories of neighborhoods, blocks, and streets represent Fort Wayne history at its most grassroots level. Such studies help give a flavor for the types of businesses and ethnic or residential neighborhoods that have existed in the city. The history of a particular house and its various occupants provides another twist on this specialized theme - an effort akin to genealogy but sometimes of more value to the local historian. Most of the works in this category are secondary histories, though there are also architectural inventories, which identify neighborhood boundaries and give historical background, and official neighborhood planning reports. Architectural studies have value to those with an interest in local preservation, not only for the contextual information they contain about neighborhood life, but also as avenues leading to a deeper understanding of local culture and its aesthetics.

NEWSPAPERS, OBITUARY INDEXES, ABSTRACTS, & HISTORIES

Newspapers represent one of the the most significant unexplored sources of research into Fort Wayne's past. They offer a daily or weekly chronicle of city life, together with advertisements, local gossip, editorials, and a variety of other minutia left out of the local histories. Yet these tidbits, when carefully gleaned and studied, become the mortar of building blocks for new historical inquiries. Some events and organizations, in the absence of any official records, can be documented only through coverage by the press.

Fort Wayne's newspaper holdings, while extensive from the 1840s, are not complete. Some titles, including most of the German-language newspapers, remain lost or destroyed. Except for obituary references, most lack any sort of subject index until only recently. Indeed, even the compilers of obituary indexes missed some names. [The *Journal-Gazette* offers an archival online search of its past issues since 1992. Library users can find it by clicking on the "Magazines and Newspapers" icon on the Library's home page.]

The following bibliographical list contains a record of Fort Wayne newspapers and periodicals, together with indexes and obituary abstracts available to date. There are also references to brief histories and bibliographies of the local press. Microfilmed copies of the original newspapers are located in the Library's Periodicals section, where there is also a limited card file index to some newspapers of the 1930s. One should also check the Library's *Periodicals Holding List*, located in Periodicals, for the current year to find a complete list of periodicals and newspapers received by or housed in that Department.

The following year, again under new ownership, its title changed to the *Fort Wayne Democrat*, under which it remained until 1873, when it was again sold and renamed the *Sentinel*. In 1918, it merged with the *Fort Wayne Daily News* to form the *News and Sentinel*, later the *News-Sentinel*.

Fort Wayne Standard, 1854-1855. /microfilm, Periodicals/ An abolitionist newspaper published by D. W. Burroughs between 1854 and 1856. It was purchased by R. D. Turner, who renamed it the *Fort Wayne Jeffersonian*.

After several more changes in ownership, it was reacquired by Dawson in 1853 as a weekly edition and retitled. Published concurrently as a weekly edition between 1849 and 1859.

Fort Wayne Times and People's Press, 1844-1848. /microfilm, Periodicals/
Successor to the *Times* resulting from its merger with the *People's Press*. It represented the major Whig paper in Fort Wayne under the editorship of John W. Dawson. It was sold again in 1848, but continued publication until 1856, when it was renamed *Dawson's Times and Union*.

Fort Wayne Today, 1984-1986. /Periodicals/ A features magazine with articles on current themes and extensive advertising.

Newspaper founded in December, 1868 by T. S. Taylor as a Republican newspaper. It underwent several changes of ownership before merging with the *Daily Gazette* in 1899 to form the *Fort Wayne Journal Gazette*.

PARKS

Parks have played a major role in the history of recreation and sports in Fort Wayne. They were a gathering place for the average citizen, a place for amusements, games, even beer-drinking for the Germans. The works found here fall into two categories: secondary histories, many of which contain historic photographs, and official park reports compiled for the city.

PICTORIAL WORKS

Pictorial representations of Fort Wayne, whether historical or promotional in design, provide an invaluable evidentiary source for the city's past. They can help document businesses, streets and houses, providing glimpses of scenes that have changed radically in more than a century. Many of the photographs found in these sources are also included in the Digital Library, available online through the Library's website. They are searchable by subject and keyword. Some images in books remain undigitized and can only be found by examining the books themselves. Because they are not among those books covered by the *Index of Persons and Firms*, their contents can be difficult to ascertain and may require a diligent search through many titles in order to find a particular image.

The annotations to the sources below are intended to assist the house researcher or local historian determine if a photograph exists for a particular residence. They are not intended as comprehensive descriptors of their contents. In addition, the works included here have generally a geographical scope. Though some also contain portraits, the researcher looking specifically for these images should check the "Portraits" category.

The Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society houses a significant photographic collection for the city, as do the offices of ARCH and the city's Historic Preservation Department. The photographic archives of the local newspapers is reportedly also of significant size, though public access remains restricted.

POLITICS AND VOTING RECORDS

Under this category are two basic types of records: voting lists and political histories. Voting records offer a kind of census substitute for names of local citizens in various election years. They have value to the genealogist and local historian in helping to connect a person at a particular address during a specific time. Regretably, most extant poll books date to relatively recent periods and have little value for 19th century research. Political histories provide context to the voting records and offer insights into the historical significance of candidates, campaigns, and issues in the city's past, some of which were exceedingly colorful.

PORTRAITS

Portrait books of Fort Wayne consist of pictorial works designed to promote the business interests of the city, and historical works, also known as “mug books,” which contain flattering biographies and numerous portraits of prominent citizens. In the 19th and early 20th centuries, the featured group was almost always exclusively male.

Accessing the contents of these volumes for an image of a particular person may require some effort. First, the researcher should check the Digital Library, available online through the Library’s website, since the contents of these works, in some instances, have been digitized. One should also check the *Index of Persons and Firms* for an indication of a major article on a particular person, though it does not specify whether a portrait is included. The first volume of Bert Griswold’s *Pictorial History of Fort Wayne* contains numerous drawings of pioneers, mostly men but also some women. Beyond these references, one may have to check some of the other sources directly for a particular image. Chances are reasonably good that if a man was prominent in business during the last quarter of the 19th century or first quarter of the 20th, he was depicted in some promotional or historical work.

The Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society has an extensive portrait collection, including photographs and some paintings and sketches, most of which are listed in their own catalogs and in-house finding aids.

SCHOOLS AND EDUCATION

Fort Wayne's strong educational history can trace its origins to the city's early adoption of the public school system in 1858 and the tradition of commitment to parochial education by its Catholics and Lutherans. A significant portion of the records listed here consists of school yearbooks and alumni programs, both of which have been exceedingly popular in the 20th century. Several school histories also appear on the list. Actual student and faculty records from Fort Wayne's schools occasionally appear in various school reports, but original records are not extant in the Library's holdings (though the records of some township schools are available). The researcher should try the office of the school itself, if it still exists, to access student records.

SPORTS HISTORY

Judging from their extensive coverage in the local press, spectator sports have been a popular pastime in Fort Wayne for generations, dating back well into the 19th century. Yet in spite of this strong interest, comparatively few histories have been written to document players, games, and fans. Perhaps the nature of sports limits interest primarily to the time of play rather than retrospective appreciation. The few books and articles listed below trace the history of various sports in the Summit City. In addition, the researcher may wish to examine more general works, such as Ankenbruck's *Twentieth Century History of Fort Wayne*, for additional references. TAX RECORDS

Tax records have secondary value for both genealogical and historical research, but they are usually not standard sources to which one typically turns. Genealogists find them useful substitutes for the federal census by helping to establish a presence in the area in the years between the censuses. Local historians use them when searching for clues to the age of a building (a rise in a tax rate may be evidence for the construction of a building). The appearance of a person's name on a tax list does not prove residency, since some land owners held property in the city but lived elsewhere. Fort Wayne's extant property, inheritance, and sales tax records are incomplete. The list below includes those records that have been either filmed or published. Many other records are apparently lost. The Assessor's Office maintains current property tax records for the city.

TRANSPORTATION

From the time of its earliest beginnings as a fort at the confluence of the three rivers, Fort Wayne has been a major crossroads in the upper Midwest. In the early 19th century, it served as a portage for travelers going from the St. Mary's to the Wabash River. Later in the 1830s, its importance grew with the construction of the Wabash-Erie Canal. After the Civil War, several major railroad lines converged in the city, and its importance was enhanced by the construction of the shops of the Pittsburgh, Fort Wayne, and Chicago Railroad. In the 20th century, the Lincoln Highway passed through Fort Wayne, making it one of the major stopping points for cross-continental travel.

The majority of books in this section pertain to canal, rail, and air travel, though a few other topics appear as well. Additional works on the canal era can be found in the "Histories 1820-1900" section. Researchers interested in railroad photographs should consult the Digital Library online. Locally, the Three Rivers Railroad Heritage Council also maintains an extensive collection of historic photographs. Those with an interest in the canal may wish to contact the Canal Society of Indiana for additional sources, while Lincoln Highway researchers should consult the Indiana Chapter of the Lincoln Highway Association.

VITAL RECORDS

Vital records, like census records, constitute a basic source for the genealogist in doing family history research. The first type of official vital record kept in the Fort Wayne area were marriage license records, which date from 1824. The earliest record books show the names of the bride and groom and the official or clergyman performing the marriage. They do not list the names of parents of the bride and groom 1890s, and even then the records are incomplete until well into the 20th century. The researcher should also be aware that in the mid 19th century, some persons living in the city and Allen County chose to marry in church and never applied for an official license. Hence the only record of those marriages, if they exist, will be found in church books.

Death records were kept by the city's Health Department beginning in 1870; birth records in 1882. Before 1920, only a small portion of the total number these events actually appear in the records. The system relied on the reporting of births and deaths by the attending physician. Often they occurred without a physician present and hence went unreported. In the absence of a vital record, the researcher should check other sources of vital record information, including census schedules, church registers, obituaries, mortuary records, and headstones in cemeteries. Many of these sources pre-date the keeping of vital records.

The Library's collection includes a variety of sources for official vital records, including films of original record books and a variety of indexes and abstracts. The Allen County-Fort Wayne Historical Society also houses some original death record volumes from the 1930s that have not been microfilmed.

WILL, PROBATE, AND GUARDIANSHIP RECORDS

The broad topic of probate records includes a variety of documents, all of which are typically used by genealogists. Wills are written instruments in which one bequeaths all real and personal property to an heir or group of heirs. As documents, they represent an important primary source of family relationships. The court keeps a transcription of every will filed in Allen County in a numbered will book.

Intestate records are created when a person dies without a will. The court appoints an administrator to settle the estate and pay off all outstanding debts. He or she swears an oath and posts a bond, which is recorded in a bond book. The court also collects documents related to the settlement of the estate, including inventories of all property sold, records of outstanding bills, and prices of items sold at estate sales. A list of heirs sometimes appears on file as well, which can be a valuable genealogical source.

Guardianship records are generated when a deceased person dies with minor children. In the 19th century, they occurred on the death of a man, even when his wife survived him. The court appoints a legal guardian of the children, who also posts bond and reports to the court at various intervals on payments made to support the children.

The records that follow include microfilms of original documents and some compiled abstracts of records. A good research strategy involves examining the abstracts first to determine if a document of interest is extant. Often the abstract will cite the book and page of the original, which will enable one to search the microfilm of the original volumes with greater ease.

WOMEN

After many years of neglect, historians have begun to make some progress in recent years in reconstructing the history of Fort Wayne women, but much remains to be done. Women were virtually ignored by local historians in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Biographical sketches in local town and county histories focused largely on the accomplishments of men and gave only incidental references to their wives and daughters.

Women's roles in society changed dramatically in the course of the 20th century, yet scholars have yet to undertake a formal study of those changes in a local context. A list of local sources on the history of women are recorded here. The researcher should also look for the names of specific local women in the "Biographical" section, as there are a significant number of articles and a few manuscript collections listed there.
