SCHOOL DIRECTOR'S REPORT.

The Board of School Directors met March 9, 1900, and organized by electing J. J. Brown Chairman, and D. E. Hicks Clerk, for the ensuing year.

At this meeting Miss Anna L. Webb was appointed Superintendent of Schools.

The arrangements that were made with Mr. Frank Johnson and Mrs. Barney Riley in 1899, whereby the cost of transporting their children to Wallingford school was paid by this town, has been continued for the past year.

Needed repairs have been made on school property at No. Clarendon, Spafford Hollow, East Clarendon, and Clarendon Springs.

Schools have been maintained in all the Districts in town but the Benson District.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the voters and patrons of the schools of Clarendon,—

I am pleased to say that I think our schools are in a better condition than they have been before in years, and I believe this to be due to the establishment of the graded system.

I have noted the work of our schools quite closely for several years and am prepared to say that I think the improvement in the past three years has been greater than in any three years previous. This improvement has been especially noticeable in the schools where the same teacher has remained several terms.

Our schools are at present presided over by a very efficient corps of teachers, and I earnestly ask the hearty cooperation of the parents, knowing that without it the best results cannot be obtained.

Feeling that the time is not far distant when it will be necessary to take some action in the matter, I take this opportunity to call attention to the condition of the school houses, some of which are hardly fit for use: the one at North Clarendon being altogether too small for the accommodation of the school, which is the largest in town.

I believe that if the voters of Clarendon realized the true condition of things that they would feel that from the erection of new buildings and the consolidation of our schools we should obtain the most good.
